Our February QQ meeting features a community sew-in for comfort Quilts. Louis Cohen is the lead for this meeting and information about the meeting is below.

QQ Comfort Quilts Extravaganza 2020

Tuesday, February 11, 2020 Come to Schmooze: 6:45 then quilt: 7:00-9:00 PM

Come join us for our annual QQ Comfort Quilt Extravaganza, an evening of sewing, schmoozing and fun.

We are continuing to use an old favorite, the "Disappearing Nine Patch". Since the November retreat, guild members sewed a total of 230 nine patch blocks or a total of 920 blocks to make into finished quilt tops. AMAZING! Additionally, we have finished quilt tops donated by members.

This year we will have 3 main activities to choose from:

- Sew nine patch blocks (with ¼ inch seams) from precut and sorted 5" squares. Finished blocks will be ironed and cut at a later time. (directions will be provided)
- Sew already finished blocks into a quilt top. Blocks will be presorted and bagged with layout suggestions. Additional blocks may be available to sort and bag.
- Sandwich and pin some of our already completed quilt tops.

Additionally, we need people to act as facilitators assisting sewers and collecting and bagging completed blocks.



Mini-Quilts for the 2020 Quilt Show

We'd like to encourage all members to participate in making mini-quilts to sell as souvenirs at the show to benefit the guild. In case you need a refresher on our mini-quilt project, here are the directions:

Supplies

- Some ultra-firm stabilizer such as Peltex 70. You'll be fusing fabric to the stabilizer so can get either Peltex 71F, which is fused on one side or Peltex 72F, which is fused on both sides.
- A fusible web such as Misty Fuse or Light Steam A Seam II.
- Fabric & thread, embellishments

Directions

- Cut a piece of stabilizer 5" x 8"
- Cut a background fabric that is 5 1/2" x 8 1/2, so a bit bigger than the stabilizer.
- Come up with an image or a design. This is a great opportunity to use your scraps!
- Once you have decided what design and fabric to use, fuse them to the background fabric you've selected for the front.
- Sew down the individual pieces after they are fused. Feel free to free motion quilt around each piece and do some decorative stitches or embellish with beads, trim, etc.
- Once the front is complete fuse it to one side of the stabilizer. Trim to size
- Cut another piece of fabric 5 1/2" x 8 1/2" and fuse it to the back of the stabilizer. Trim.
- Zig zag around the perimeter of the piece to finish the edges.

GUILT is our enemy! Shed tears if you must but GIVE THEM AWAY. "Here is a second chance - bring them to the February QQ meeting and give to Louise and Caroline, Comfort Quilt coordinators,

Here is this month's tip from Pat Sloan

We all have them.

- That set of blocks that never got increased enough for a quilt.
- A single block or two from a workshop
- a set of swap blocks that came 'out' of the swap due to color (or something OTHER reason)
- or a group of blocks that you decided you just didn't like the fabric choices enough to move on.

You may even have some Dear Jane blocks or just FOUR Baltimore Album blocks instead of 16, or how about that BOM project that you lost enthusiasm over?

Turn those small bits into other projects by looking at them with a critical eye.

- Can you take the set of blocks and make a small wall hanging?
- Make into a table topper? Several blocks set side by side make awesome table runners!
- How about taking blocks and making them into tote bags, or pillows?
- Turn the blocks on point and make a LARGER quilt with fewer blocks... set with alternating fabric squares and an even Bigger quilt appears!
- How about placemats, coasters, hot pads?

Lots of these projects can be converted and called D-O-N-E and even GIFTED! Gotta love it! If you love the blocks but don't really feel like doing the rest. DON'T!! Permission granted... let's GO SEW!

QQ Block of the Month

Our January block is a Zinnia flower, the pattern and photos are below. We will have copies of it at the meeting along with measurement and other tips from Diana.


Note from Diana: I am always generous with my fabric measurements, so I don't have to fiddle around with the placement.

MEASUREMENTS


- B4 is the stem-2" strip
- C2 and A14 is one leaf-2" strip
- B2 and A16 is the other leaf-2" strip
- the rest of the bottom square is background-2" strip
- A9 is background- 2 1/2 strip
- A1 to A12 is the flower (you can see that point ends at the B4 stem piece 1 1/2 strip
- the background pieces are A17, A4, A13, A15, C1, C3, B1, B3-2" strip


TIPS

- As a help I added step by step photos of the Zinnia construction
- The Zinnia pattern may look a bit confusing. I found it helpful to look at the colored example and label the pieces with your fabric choice color ahead of time. I also color coded each piece
- sew 2 smaller pieces together before ripping off the paper
- don't forget to bring show and tell and you will get a raffle ticket!



Art Show

Sara Schechner's quilts will be featured in a semi-solo art show in Dracut, Massachusetts on March 6-7, 2020. The show is produced by Dracut Arts, a non-profit dedicated to fostering interest in the arts by the production and presentation of musical concerts, art shows, poetry readings, cable-TV interviews, and seminars dealing with matters of general artistic interest.

Dracut Arts produces six two-day arts events each year for the greater Dracut Community. Each event showcases an Art Show, Author Reading and Q&A, and a Performance. On Friday March 6, the art show features quilter Sara Schechner and painter Lucilda Dassardo-Cooper from 4– 9 pm, with an artists' reception 7 – 9 pm. On Saturday March 7, Dan Szczesny, journalist and author, will do a reading at 2 pm. His latest book is *The White Mountain: Rediscovering Mount Washington's Hidden Culture*. From 7-9 pm Saturday evening, there will be a performance by the Lotus Sound, an experimental circle singing group based in Boston. The improvisational *acapella* music is Inspired by the African roots of circle singing and the music of Bobby McFerrin.
