Letter from the Co-President

Dear Quilters,

UFOs, PROCRASTINATION, and your BRAIN

Why is procrastination so ubiquitous, as if it is wired into our DNA? Some people clearly have less difficulty with procrastination than others and complete one task (e.g. one quilt) before they move on to the next. But I wonder if even they may use the excuse of completing that project to put off some other type of task??

Basically, I think procrastination comes down to the challenge of making decisions. We naturally shun things that make us uncomfortable and often do almost anything else to avoid that confrontation with reality. But the task seems to expand mysteriously as we let time slip by and it almost takes on the magnitude of a battle with Goliath. And to avoid that conflict, sometimes we'll do almost anything else. For quilters, our strategy may be a little different because it is so easy to "lose" the project under a pile of fabrics, then other things get moved and piled on top and before we know it the deferred project has disappeared! Then we buy more fabric and start another project, so we can really forget about the one that was troubling us. But lurking somewhere in our subconscious, or not so subconscious, we know we have accumulating UFOs (UnFinished Objects).

Procrastination can be a major time thief. It can rob us of the present because we are ruminating over why we don't want to do X, of all the possible unpleasant outcomes or just the nastiness of the task. And yet, when we finally get to it and



plow through it, we usually discover that it really is not as bad as what we had constructed in our mind. Even with that knowledge though, I still struggle with procrastination. For some reason, I seem to tell myself that "I do better under pressure", that it "helps the creative juices flow" and all other forms of rationalization. Unfortunately, for some things, that is true. With just the proper dose of stress and time-pressure, the adrenaline does pump up and, amazingly, I come up with ideas and solutions that just are not there at an earlier time—maybe. Possibly the same thoughts would have come to me in a more relaxed state, but I've programmed myself to believe that I am most creative with a deadline looming. I think, in some ways, we almost become addicted to this pattern of behavior, partly because of the



adrenaline "rush" we experience, which has a certain exhilarating quality.

So, what is an antidote to procrastination? Mainly it involves time-management skills and scheduling:

- 1. Mark it on your calendar/schedule when you are going to work on it and a deadline.
- 2. Set a *time limit* for how long you will work on the task, allowing some flexibility in case you are on a roll (as long as it doesn't put you off schedule for other responsibilities).
- 3. Attack the most difficult or dreaded thing first, usually earlier in the day—but pay attention to *your* energy peaks and lows (your circadian rhythm) and don't start the project at a low point (like the 3pm need chocolate revival time).
- 4. Schedule enough time—seems obvious but can be the most difficult for those of us who are great as visuospatial assessment but not so hot at estimating time aliquots. These skills can be learned from family and friends who are more adept.
- 5. If you are really stuck, seriously consider *why* you are doing the project in the first place. Is it still valid and important to you? If not, give yourself the freedom to let it go and move on.
- 6. Don't go it alone: telling someone you can trust to encourage and not chide you when you confide your plan can be a great motivator. *Writing it down* also really helps. In QQ we have the perfect solution with *Robin Jaeger's UFO/NYS challenge*—thank you, Robin!

Hostessing includes:

- Walking around the floor among the quilts monitor the rooms, answer our guests' questions about the quilts and quilting, and make sure only people with white gloves touch the quilts.
- Sitting at the front desk/cashier greet our guests, collect admission fees, and sell raffle tickets.
- Sitting at our guild demo/info table answer questions about the guild and demonstrate basic quilting techniques by working on a comfort quilt.
- Stand-by in case someone cannot make their shift at the last minute, then you'll get a call. Consider doing this for a shift that is before or after your appointed shift.

Attached is the pattern for the final QQ 2020 Block of the Month. This month's flower is the Amaryllis Bulb. It's a fun and pretty square that should be enjoyable to sew. As usual, we'll bring block printouts to the March meeting. Diana included step by step visuals putting together the Amaryllis.

Here are some cutting tips for the Amaryllis:


- Color code the pattern pieces so you don't get confused while you are planning what to do next
- We find cutting strips is easier. This gives you material to grab onto while you take the pieces to the machine to sew. This way you don't waste time pinning.
- o Use 2" strips except for:
 - 2 1/2 strips-A3, A5, B1, B2, B4, B5
 - 2 3/4 strips- A1, A6, B3







